Message from Christopher Dawe


This week we celebrate the Feast of Epiphany. The proper date for it is January 6th, but most churches these days keep it on the nearest Sunday. What's the Epiphany about? My old Book of Common Prayer calls it *The Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles*. That sounds a rather stuffy name but it points to an important truth: God was reaching out to include outsiders in his message of joy brought to the world through Jesus' birth. If you have received or sent any Christmas cards, it's almost certain that one will have an image of a baby in a stable, and one will have an image of three kings.

The story has been overlaid with a lot of legend, but it is thought that the 'kings' were philosophers or priests from Persia who sought truth through study of the stars. Somehow they were guided to Jerusalem and there they asked about the birth of the king of the Jews, which upset king Herod somewhat, but enquiries were made and they were sent to Bethlehem and found the child Jesus. There they offered him three gifts, each pointing to a significant truth about him. Gold, a gift for a king, Frankincense, a gift for a priest, and Myrrh for one who is to die. A king rules a state and so ensures our safety. A priest is one who builds a bridge between us and God, and remember, if you didn't know it, that Jesus is a priest forever after the order of Melchizedek (look up Hebrews chapter 5). The Myrrh pointed to the death that earns our salvation.

This story and the truths it points to, seem to me to be so appropriate for today's troubles in society. Climate change, Brexit, Covid, and global power struggles. To sort these problems out we need to respect each other and work together – for we are, all of us, God's creation.

A Reading for the Week

Matthew 2:1-12

2In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ²asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: ⁶"And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the ruler of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

7Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. 8Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. 11On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
