Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶ When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, "Woman, here is your son," ²⁷ and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

Message from Rev Eric Lomax

Mothering Sunday comes from a very ancient pagan festival, remembering the goddess Cybele. In the fourth century the first Christian emperor, Constantine, adapted it to celebrate Mary and the 'Mother Church.' The Church took it seriously as a festival in which domestic servants were set free once a year to go and see their own mothers and this was often the only time that these people could come together to be with their own families.

It was during that time that these people in servitude would be freed to attend the churches in the communities where they were born and baptised. The Church, which was referred to as 'mother church,' was to them the restoration of their own sense of self as being part of a community. It was freedom from servitude, and the restoration of their own sense of human identity. For one day a year, they could be completely themselves.

This, therefore, is really a significant time for us, as a nation, when so many people are separated from their families and loved ones during lockdown.

25 years ago, on 13th March 1996, a lone gunman, Thomas Hamilton, marched into a primary school in Dunblane, Scotland and shot sixteen pupils and one teacher, killing them all and injuring fifteen others, before killing himself. Still today, it is impossible to not think of the mothers who dressed their children, gave them their packed lunches, and dropped them off for the last time. How, as a mother or a parent do you ever get over such a loss? The other day I heard the story of a mother whose child complained of being ill that day and wanted to stay at home. I cannot conceive of the level of guilt that mother experiences, yet in truth, she did what she had to do.

Here, in today's reading, we experience the turmoil of a mother who is watching her son suffer and the agony of Jesus' death where our saviour, through his self-sacrifice mends our broken relationship with him.

Mary knew the experience of suffering.

It was her pain, like the pain of all mothers, which unlocked the Lord of life to the world, and she did this in the poverty of a room used to house animals. She had been, like other refugees, torn from her own home, her own mother, and all of this, while her life was under threat. Not only this, but in a strict religious society, her reputation was in tatters, because her childbirth took place outside wedlock. Now, at the foot of the cross, Mary suffered the beating and death of her son, a terrible and unmendable thing for any woman to experience.

Years before, in the Temple, an old man, Simeon, had told Mary what to expect; 'For a sword will pierce your heart' (Luke 2:33), but the old man also told her how important Jesus would be. It was not until all these years later that Mary understood what this man's words meant. In the cloud of this experience of watching her son die, however, it must have been so difficult for her to understand why this terrible thing had to happen.

For those mothers who have suffered the pain of loss, Mary is a powerful symbol of somebody who understood the deepest experiences of parenthood, and for those who on a day-to-day basis know the struggle often associated with motherhood, we can find, in the biblical stories, the narrative of empathy. God understands us, because he, like Mary, has witnessed the suffering and death of his only son.

Whatever you have known as a parent, you find the deepest understanding in the words of scripture.

There is a second thing that we can find in this reading as well.

Jesus, on the cross, had only a few people remaining when everybody else had fled. These were four women, which illustrates clearly what the writer of the fourth gospel thought about which gender was in possession of the most courage. One of the women was the mother of Jesus, who the writer of the fourth Gospel never names. The only male is also not named, but he is described as 'The disciple whom Jesus loved.' 'Woman,' he said, 'here is your son,' and to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.'

There is something profound going on here. Jesus creates a brand-new relationship between these two disparate people. Together they became a new family of believers which we know as the church. A new family is created in the foot of the cross. Through the death of Jesus, a new community of faith is born.

Our families are so important to us, and we should do all we can to preserve the riches of these relationships. Mothering Sunday, however, teaches us that an extended family is available to us as well. This is a rich and deep family that embraces not only our own families, but equally those who are burdened with loneliness and isolation, because in the church, the family of God, no one should ever be alone.

We, the church, like every family, have decided this year to be separate, like every other extended family during this Covid crisis. We do this because we want to demonstrate our solidarity with everybody else. We do meet, however, every Sunday on Zoom, at 11am and you are welcome to join us. The Zoom ID is 998 074 6039. Please pop in and be part of our family, the mother church. Please remember that this family of the church cares for you, for your family, and for your children, so together we pray for you with the following prayer from the Bible.

'For this reason, I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.' (Ephesians 3)

Walk/cycle/scoot around the parish hunting for the eggs and collecting the letters.


When you have collected all the letters, rearrange them to give a word or message associated with Easter.
