A Reading for the Week

John 2:13-20

When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover. Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me." The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days." They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?"

Message from Rev Eric Lomax

What was Jesus' problem? In our story today, Jesus appears to have a violent temper tantrum in the Jerusalem Temple, but what was he so angry about?

Pilgrims from all over Israel would come to this Holy place to meet with God. It was the place where everything, where wealth and status were levelled before the Great God. There should have been nobody who was better than another, all were the same before God.

This, in the end, was far from the reality. From the moment they arrived, they were exploited so that they could meet with God. To come close to God, there had to be a sacrifice, and for this, the weak, the poor and the helpless were hit harder than the rich.

To buy a dove for food would cost a whole day's wages, but to purchase one fit for sacrifice, perfect and unblemished, would cost half a week's wages. The problem was, that to get close to God, that was required.

The minute you entered the Temple you were required to pay the Temple tax. For this you would need to pay two day's wages. The trouble is, when you turned up, even that was not good enough. The Temple authorities would not accept your money because it had the emperor's head on it. The Jewish law forbade images in the Temple, so these coins were forbidden in the Temple.

The pilgrims would have to spend their two days' wages on Temple coins, but to buy their two days' worth would cost them another day's wages.

Message from Rev Eric Lomax continued

It was pure exploitation of the pilgrims. These people longed to come close to the living God, but in order for them to do that they had to pay for the privilege. Of course the poor were hit much harder than the rich. Is that really what God is like?

Of course not, and that is what made Jesus so angry. Jesus, the son of the living God, brought the message that the love of God is a free gift, and the poor are as welcome as the rich.

The Jewish people believed that they were the chosen people of God. They believed that God had promised to Abraham, their founding Father, that through them all the families of the earth would be blessed. So Gentiles (non-Jews) from all the families of the earth would come from all over the Greco-Roman world to meet this great God in the Temple. The trouble was that they were forbidden from fully entering the Temple by a people who saw themselves as the chosen people. These Pilgrims could only come to the outer courts of the Temple, the court of the Gentiles. Instead of finding hospitality and prayer, they found these exploitative money changers and con-men. Instead of peace, they found a busy market.

This made Jesus angry because he wanted to welcome all into the presence of God. Only some were the chosen for the religion of Judaism, but everybody was chosen to be the recipient of God's love and peace.



So Jesus, the promised Messiah of Israel, came to the centre of the Jewish Religion, not to affirm the religious practices of Israel, but to turn that religion upside down. This is what he did. He turned over the tables of the money changers and, taking a whip of chords, he sent the market traders packing.

It seems like anger, but it was the ultimate act of love. He was throwing open the gates to God's presence to everybody; Jews and Gentiles, outsiders and insiders.

He was expelling those who demanded money and giving free entry to the presence of God. It no longer mattered if you were poor or rich, God placed everybody on the same level. It was now free to come into the presence of God.

Two thousand years ago, this was the case, and it is still the case now. God is not exclusive but loves and welcomes everybody because of what Jesus did. It does not depend on your wealth, your background, the ways you have succeeded, the ways you have failed. God loves you completely and unconditionally. You are welcome into his Kingdom. You are loved.
