

Reading for the Week John 2.1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Message from Rev Eric Lomax

All is well, we have not run out of wine. The bottom two shelves of the white wine section of Sainsbury's in Great Denham has a section which is, invariably, nearly empty. It is the section that sells cheap, white, £5.50 bottles of Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Grigio. Particularly on Sunday evening we find that this shelf is empty, and we know this because it is invariably the bottle that we need.

I guess that this is something to do with our human condition, a dissatisfied, predominantly utilitarian society that feels unfulfilled, and somehow incomplete, and on Sunday evenings, before the week begins, we need something that numbs us to the mindless TV on our screens, and the mundanity of the week ahead.

For many of us, when we reach the next day, there is the feeling that the wind has run out, our energy and our purpose is spent, which is why I feel that this week's reading could make such a continued on next page...

powerful connection with us. The Gospel story tells us that, in terms of the life we are leading, there is a much better wine on the shelf (I am not talking about Sainsbury's here!).

This story is about the aspirations of these people in first century Jewish society. Life, whether it was the religious or the secular, had become empty, dry and meaningless. The party (in this case, a wedding), had run out of steam, and metaphorically, the wine had run out.

Jesus arrived at the party with his disciples, and transformed everything. With a little shove from his mother, he took what was already there (the six stone jars for ritual washing) and transformed their contents into the new wine of God's Kingdom. It was this that everybody in the party described as the 'very best wine.'

It is easy to feel despair and hopelessness, especially considering the current brokenness and fractures of the last two years. What this reading tells each of us is that he has much more to offer us than cheap wine, despair, and hopelessness. With faith, he invites us to his party. He invites us to call on him, to enter the lives that we already had. He will perform the miracle of transformation in our lives. This is not the time for despair, this is a time for hope. If we trust in Jesus, the best is yet to come. God bless, Eric

The All Age Bit

This week we are looking at a reading from the book of 1 Corinthians which is in the New Testament of your Bible. This reading talks about Spiritual Gifts and says that, through our helper, the Holy Spirit, we can receive Spiritual Gifts from God which we can then use to love and serve others. Read through the passage and see how many different Spiritual Gifts, e.g. to speak with wisdom, you can find in the passage. Which one of these Spiritual Gifts would you most like to have?

When Jesus was on the earth people followed him not just because of what he said but because of the amazing things he did. How do you think people might respond if we used our Spiritual Gifts in our daily lives to help and serve others? Activities:

Secret whispers - sit in a circle and pass a whispered message around the circle. Is the message the same when it has travelled all the way around the group? Think about how we have a message about God's love to pass on to others through our words and actions. The Holy Spirit can help us to find the right words to use.

Talent Show - God gives us Spiritual Gifts but we all have talents and skills which God has also given us. Hold a family/friends talent show to give everyone a chance to share a gift or skill. What will your talent be? Singing? Playing a musical instrument? Painting a picture? Reading a story? Demonstrating sports skills?

Gifts from the Holy Spirit

Now, brothers, I want you to understand about spiritual gifts. You remember the lives you lived before you were believers. You let yourselves be influenced and led away to worship idols—things that have no life. So I tell you that no one who is speaking with the help of God's Spirit says, "Jesus be cursed." And no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," with-

out the help of the Holy Spirit.

There are different kinds of gifts; but they are all from the same Spirit. There are different ways to serve; but all these ways are from the same Lord. And there are different ways that God works in people; but all these ways are from the same God. God works in us all in everything we do. Something from the Spirit can be seen in each person, to help everyone. The Spirit gives one person the ability to speak with wisdom. And the same Spirit gives another the ability to speak with knowledge. The same Spirit gives faith to one person. And that one Spirit gives another gifts of healing. The Spirit gives to another person the power to do miracles, to another the ability to prophesy. And he gives to another the ability to know the difference between good and evil spirits. The Spirit gives one person the ability to speak in different kinds of languages and to another the ability to interpret those languages. One Spirit, the same Spirit, does all these things. The Spirit decides what to give each person.


