MOTHERING SUNDAY

Message from Sue Richards (Reader) Is it all about the party?

The story (on the next page) in Luke's Gospel is well known – the prodigal son. But Jesus actually told three stories in this chapter, one after the other: the story of the shepherd seeking out the one lost sheep out of 100 (commonly, we talk about the black sheep of the family) and also the one about the woman who lost one of her 10 coins. These stories describe the massive effort that is made to find something that is lost, followed by the amazing joy of finding it; so much joy that there is a big party for friends and neighbours. Jesus then tells us that it is just like this when someone repents and admits to God that they have got things wrong and want to live differently; apparently there's a big party in heaven! I've always loved that idea.

Reading for the Week

Luke 15: 1-3; 11-end

¹⁵ Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

³ So he told them this parable:

The Parable of the Prodigal and His Brother

¹¹ Then Jesus said, "There was a man who had two sons. ¹² The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. ¹³ A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. ¹⁴ When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. ¹⁵ So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. ¹⁶ He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. ¹⁷ But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! ¹⁸ I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; ¹⁹ I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands.'" ²⁰ So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. ²¹ Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' ²² But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. ²³ And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; ²⁴ for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate.

²⁵ "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶ He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. ²⁷ He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' ²⁸ Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. ²⁹ But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. ³⁰ But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' ³¹ Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³² But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'"

So why did Jesus tell these stories? Well, look at the introduction to the passage. The pharisees and those who were experts in the law (the religious people of the day) were not impressed with Jesus talking to and eating with those 'awful sinners' and the despised tax collectors who were collecting money for Herod and/or the Romans. "What's the matter with him", they grumbled? "Why is he giving them his time? Surely, he should be spending it with 'good' people?.. like us". Jesus knew exactly what they were thinking. They did not want others to be blessed, especially when, in their opinion, those people clearly did not deserve it. So, he told them three stories, explaining how his focus is on seeking out the lost.

I wonder what we think when we read the prodigal son story. We might not identify so much with someone who has got things so spectacularly wrong, maybe we can, but my focus has usually been on the amazing forgiveness of the father. More so that in the culture at that time, this son would have brought great shame on the family even before he went on his way, spending his inheritance in a reckless way. And then his father's response... utter abandonment in his delight... running to meet him and embrace him when he comes home in desperation. Distinguished older men never lowered themselves to run in that culture, so this running would have astonished people of his day. Maybe you, like me, focus on the forgiving nature of this father who runs to meet his wayward child, forgiving and embracing him. I know that God has been that wonderfully forgiving Father to me.

Eugene Peterson was a minister, scholar, theologian, author, and poet. At his funeral, his son said that his father had "fooled" everyone that he had something new to say every Sunday, or in every book. He said it was always the same message and that his father had said it to him every night: **God loves you. He's on your side. He's coming after you. He's relentless.....**a love just like the prodigal's father.

Let's turn our attention to the grumbling brother, who refuses to come to the party despite his father's rationale and pleading. He's had his nose put out of joint and he certainly does not want to celebrate. He's a bit like the Pharisees. How could his father spend time with his brother and bless him in such an amazing way? His brother certainly did not deserve it and it was he himself who was the faithful one, the one who deserved to have a party thrown in his honour.

Then we need to ask ourselves a tricky question: who might we consider unworthy of Jesus' attention? Where would Jesus hang out if he were living in our village or town? In the churches? Let's imagine for a minute; imagine Jesus with those we really don't like for whatever reason and then imagine Jesus blessing them with success, popularity and wealth.

As Christians, we strive to be like Jesus, but we do struggle, deep within their own hearts, to be celebrating the successes of others, especially when those successes really seem to be unfairly won.

Can we join in the party when we see God at work in other people's lives in ways that we wish were true for ourselves? Come with me, let us not be like the prodigal son's brother... let's celebrate the attention and favour God pours out on us and others. Irrespective of whether we deserve it or not! Will we choose to be grumblers or party goers?

Exodus 2 v 1-10

² There was a man from the family of Levi. He married a woman who was also from the family of Levi. ² She became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She saw how wonderful the baby was, and she hid him for three months. ³ But after three months, she was not able to hide the baby any longer. So she got a basket made of reeds and covered it with tar so that it would float. She put the baby in the basket. Then she put the basket among the tall grass at the edge of the Nile River. ⁴ The baby's sister stood a short distance away. She wanted to see what would happen to him.

⁵ Then the daughter of the king of Egypt came to the river. She was going to take a bath. Her servant girls were walking beside the river. She saw the basket in the tall grass. So she sent her slave girl to get it. ⁶ The king's daughter opened the basket and saw the baby boy. He was crying, and she felt sorry for him. She said, "This is one of the Hebrew babies."

⁷ Then the baby's sister asked the king's daughter, "Would you like me to find a Hebrew woman to nurse the baby for you?"

⁸ The king's daughter said, "Yes, please." So the girl went and got the baby's own mother.

⁹ The king's daughter said to the woman, "Take this baby and nurse him for me. I will pay you." So the woman took her baby and nursed him. ¹⁰ After the child had grown older, the woman took him to the king's daughter. She adopted the baby as her own son. The king's daughter named him Moses because she had pulled him out of the water.
